The undermentioned Men, being good Indian fighters and having on all occasions, since the commencement of the War, shown their loyalty and courage in the field where they always volunteered with the Indians, I beg leave to recommend them to be appointed Interpreters in the Indian Department to serve with the Western Indians by whom they are well known.

Their Names are Francois Pajum & Jacques Tashelena

I also humbly propose placing Simon and James Gerty on the Pension List, both being superannuated the one blind and the other lame, their long & faithful Service in particular to Simon I think deserves consideration.

Capt. Mr. Murphy's pay as shown at present be confirmed he might be ordered to interpret for the Six Nations from the "Western", or Simon Gerty called upon at General Councils.
