I enclose a letter which I have received from the Hon^{ble} Mr. Wood concerning certain Requisitions and a Report on the Alderwill School furnished by the Hon^{ble} Mr. Case. You will be pleased to visit the Institution and submit any observations that may occur to you respecting its present condition and in reference to the statements contained in these documents. The Governor General expects to observe that many of the children have not returned to the school since the vacation granted them last autumn, and that their shoes have not yet been supplied. The proposition of Mr. Case to do so from other Tribes will it is to be feared be productive of much discontent and every exertion should be made to induce the distant contributing Indians to send their quota of scholars. If that be impossible it may perhaps be the better course to economize the expenditure at Maniwik and proceed as soon as possible to establish a third school on the Sangar Tract.

You will request Mr. Case to hand you detailed Statements of the outlay incurred this year in completing the fences and Buildings.

I am directed by the Governor General to inform you that I have received a communication from the Hon^{ble} the Secy. Genl. relative to the debt due by you to the Sea Nations Indians on account of Earl Selkirk's Mortgage, stating,

That in November 1846 you were apprized by the Hon^{ble} W. Morris Secy. General that the claim against you then was £1172

In March 1849 by the Hon^{ble} Mr. Biggs Secy. General that with interest it amounted to £1336-1-8

In April 1850 by the Hon^{ble} Mr. Tache Secy. General that it had risen to £1416-4-11 and in June 1851 by the same that you were indebted to the amount of £1501-4-5

That in each of these written communications you were called upon for payment but that to none of them have you favored the Secy. General with a reply.

I am accordingly instructed to call upon you for an immediate settlement of this debt in order that the Indian claim which has been suffered to remain so long outstanding may be satisfied.
