An unsigned letter from your office addressed to Mr. Mackensie King under date of the 3rd instant was received by Mr. King during the closing days of the recent session of the Canadian Parliament. On account of the pressure of public duties up to the time of the prorogation of Parliament, Mr. King was unable to deal with any matters of correspondence, and immediately after was obliged to leave for Washington in connection with the International Labour Conference.

Not being sure that the unsigned letter is from yourself, I have hesitated to arrange to have a copy of Mr. King's book 'Industry and Humanity" sent to you as requested in the letter. I enclose, however, a circular announcement of the book which was published by Houghton Mifflin Company, Boston.
