Dalrymple vs. Laugel.

Argument of validity of "the Dominion Controlled Elections Act 1874." which imposed on judges of the superior courts the duty of trying controverted elections of members of H. of C. - It was argued the act contra to 92 sec of B. 1871, act which gave prov. control of prov. courts to Supreme court held, that Dominion felt had right to impose on judges this duty. The Supreme court upheld the validity of the act and on application to the Privy Council to have its judgment reversed their lordships refused, holding that there was ^{no} doubt as to power of the Dominion to impose new duties on the existing provincial courts.

to test validity of "an act to secure uniform conditions in policies of life insurance" argued that legis. of prov. had no power to deal with general law of insurance, that it fell within "regulation of trade and commerce" sec 91. 33. 2.
