Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 9th instant enclosing a copy of the resignation of Miss Potvin as teacher of the Pointe Bleue school.

In reply I beg to say that this resignation is accepted and you will be good enough to advise Miss Potvin accordingly.

Your recommendation that a nun be appointed as teacher of this school is approved by the Department upon one condition, that is that she be qualified as a teacher. The Department has, in several of its Roman Catholic Schools, teaching nuns who are giving excellent satisfaction and there is every reason to believe that such a person would be able to do satisfactory work at Pointe ~~Blue~~ Bleue, however, she qualifications must be insisted upon. This is a good school ~~was~~ where excellent results have been obtained in the past and it is the desire of the Department to maintain the standard of the school.
