Ottawa, 18th June, 1919.

Sir:-

The Department made request through the Hon. A.W. Charlton in November last for a quarterly statement showing Indian patients and their physical condition etc. in residence in Sanitoria under the Management of the National Sanitarium Association. Up to the present no returns have been made from the King Edward Sanitarium with regard to tubercular patients, but returns have been forwarded both from the Toronto Free Hospital and the Muskoka Free Hospital, and I may say that the Department will be glad in future to receive returns also from the King Edward Sanitarium. The form used by the Toronto Free Hospital has been found satisfactory, although requiring amendment in one particular. A copy of the last return received from that Institution is transmitted herewith. You will observe it gives the name of each patient, the date of admission, date of discharge, condition on admission, condition on discharge and condition still in residence. The Department wishes also to be informed in each case of the name of the Indian Agency from which each patient came or the name of the Indian Agent who sent the patient to the Sanitarium. It is hoped that you will find it convenient to furnish the Department
