For the Prime Minister:

Dr. Wodehouse, the Deputy
Minister of Pensions and National Health,
has been most helpful and has taken a
great deal of trouble in trying to trace
the origin of the special treatment for
leukemia, of which Mr. John Lay spoke to
me over the long distance telephone, on
Saturday afternoon last.

Dr. Wodehouse has communicated with the U. S. Public Health Authorities and has finally traced, I think, the source of the report to which Mr. Lay referred. He has also passed this information on to Dr. Roy Simpson, who is attending Mr. Lay's child. The result is not very encouraging.

I am attaching a copy of a letter which Dr. Wodehouse wrote yesterday to Dr. Simpson concerning the treatment.
