

- A Yes.
- Q What did you find?
- A I found a house that the Indians occupy every year when fishing coishans, cohoes, humpbacks and dog-salmon - the land is very poor and is rather rocky, and half a mile farther up there are some tide flats.
- Q Is it an important fishing place for the Indians?
- A Yes.
- Q How many acres do you recommend for them there?
- A Five acres. (NOTE: The point should be called Laleh or Mussel Inlet)
- Q Can you identify it on the map?
- A (Examining map) Yes, and it is marked No. 19.
- Q Now Application No. 20, for land at Kwol-wa-ha - what about that?
- A I make the same remark with regard to that as I did with application No. 14.
- Q Now application No. 21 - what about that?
- A I don't recommend it.
- Q Now application No. 22 - what about that?
- A I don't recommend it.
- Q Application No. 23 - what about that?
- A I went ashore there and found evidence of Indian occupation & there is very good land there on which there are crabapples and some alder, and they also fish in the river for cohoes, humpbacks and dog-salmon, and it is a hunting base, and I thought of asking for 160 acres, but it may be occupied by a lease.
- Q Do you think they reasonably require 160 acres there if it is found available?
- A Yes, because it is the only place around there fit for agricultural purposes.
- Q Can you identify that on the map?
- A Yes, and it is marked No. 23 - (Examining blueprint) I think it is on Lot 302.
- Q Application No. 24, Sweetka, what about that?
- A I don't recommend it.
