

doubt that every Notary is possessed of certain experiences that, could they be reduced to writing would be invaluable, and that many, if not all our confrères, could give explanations of certain articles that would be unanimously accepted though possibly not generally now understood. I fear however that the majority of our confrères in this Province are unprepared to furnish the material you suggest or to subscribe to the publication.

Then again should you be successful in obtaining the consent of the Notaries at large you will have gathered together an amount of information that would constitute a more than herculean task to edit. The work if placed before you would appear to me to require the undivided attention of a considerable number of confrères. But while I see these very grave difficulties I recognize the fact that we Notaries are wanting in *esprit de corps* and that co-operation in such a work as you have so well outlined will not only, if carried to a successful issue, be invaluable to the profession but will also serve to create and perpetuate among us that loyalty to our profession which cannot but elevate to a position far higher than that we now occupy, a position which I think the honorable profession we follow, its importance and its value to our country deserve.

Wishing you every success and with many thanks for your kindness in submitting the project to me and with the assurance of my cooperation so far as I possibly can.
