ORDERED, That the Bill be committed to a Committee of the whole House.

RESOLVED, That this House will, on Friday next, resolve itself into a Committee of the whole, upon the faid Bill.

The Houfe, according to order, proceeded to take into confideration, the amendments reported from the Committee of the whole Houte, to the Bill to repeal an Ordinance, made and paffed in the twenty-fifth year of His Majetty's reign, intituled, "an Ordinance to prevent the "exportation of unmerchantable flour, and the falfe taring of bread and flour cafks," to regulate the packing and infpection of flour, Indian meal and bitcuit in future, and to fix a flandard weight of wheat, within this Province.

And the faid amendments being again feverally read, and the queftion of concurrence feparately put upon each, they were feverally agreed unto by the House.

On motion of Mr. Mure, feconded by Mr. Moore,

ORDERED, That the Bill, as amended, be ingroffed.

On motion of Mr. De Salaberry, feconded by Mr. Bertheloi,

The House adjourned to Friday next.

ORDERED, That Mr. Berthelot have leave to bring in a Bill further to continue for a limited time, an Act paffed in the forty third year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for esta-" blishing
