

**ORDERED**, That the Bill be committed to a Committee of the whole House.

**RESOLVED**, That this House will, on Friday next, resolve itself into a Committee of the whole, upon the said Bill.

The House, according to order, proceeded to take into consideration, the amendments reported from the Committee of the whole House, to the Bill to repeal an Ordinance, made and passed in the twenty-fifth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "an Ordinance to prevent the exportation of unmerchantable flour, and the false taring of bread and flour casks," to regulate the packing and inspection of flour, Indian meal and biscuit in future, and to fix a standard weight of wheat, within this Province.

And the said amendments being again severally read, and the question of concurrence separately put upon each, they were severally agreed unto by the House.
