On motion of Mr. Richardson, seconded by Mr. Berthelot,

Refolved, That an Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor, to request His Excellency that he will be pleased to issue his Warrant in favor of Samuel Phillips, Esquire, Clerk of this House, for the sum of Two hundred and seventy eight pounds eighteen shillings and sour pence currency, for desraying the balance due on the sum of three hundred and seventy eight pounds eighteen shillings and four pence currency, to which the printing Bills and the Journals of this House, Servants wages, Stationary and other contingent expences incurred by the House during the present Session amount, after deducting the sum of one hundred pounds already paid on account thereof, in pursuance of a Warrant issued by His Excellency, agreeable to an Address of this I ouse; and that the aforesaid sums be charged to the fund by Law apapropriated to that purpose.

On motion of Mr Richardson, seconded by Mr. Berthelot,

Crdered, that the Address be presented by the Members appointed to present to His Excellency, the Address of this House of yesterday.

And then on motion of Mr. De Bonne, seconded by Mr. Lorinier, The Houle adjourned till to-morrow afternoon two of the clock.

R. De Bonne and Mr. L. ster reported, that the Messengers appoint ed to wait upon His Excellency the Governor, with the Addresses of this House, had accordingly presented the same to His Excellency, who had been graciously pleased to receive them and to return a favorable answer.

On motion of Mr. Richardson, seconded by Mr. Young,

Refolved, that this House do now resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, to consider of the wages proper to be allowed to a Messenger a d a Door keeper to the Legislative Council during this Session; and that the said Committee have power to send so persons and papers.

The House accordingly resolved itself into the said Committee.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr P. L. Panet took the chair of the Committee 5.

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair,

And Mr. P. 1. Panel reported that the Committee had come to some resolutions, which he was directed to report to the House, whenever it should be pleased to receive the same.

Ordered, that the report be received to morrow.

And then on motion of Mr. P. L. Panet, seconded by Mr Berthelot. The House adjourned till to-morrow at twelve o'elock at noon.
