The Shares and Estates, Stock and Interest, of the said New Shares, &c., of Consolidated V. The Shares and Estates, Stock and Interest, of the said New Shares, ac, of Consolutate York, Newfoundland, and London Telegraph Company, in the Stock be liable for debts of New and Property of any Company with which said Company shall unite, or York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company. into which it shall merge, and the Property of the said Consolidated Company in this Colony, and between this Colony and the Continent of America, shall be, in all respects, subject and liable to the Debts, Obligations and Liabilities of the said New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company, in like manner as the Property of the last mentioned Company is now liable to such Debts, Liabilities and Obligations aforesaid.

VI. If any Person shall wilfully and maliciously throw down, Penalty for injury to proper-destroy, damage, or injure, any Post, Wire, Insulator, Cable, Line, ty of the Company. Building, Erection, Apparatus, Machinery, or other Works, or obstruct the operation of any Line of the said New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company, or of the said Atlantic Telegraph Company Limited, after such consolidation and merger, as aforesaid, or of any other Company with or into which the said New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company shall at any time unite or merge, under the Provisions of their Act, such Person shall be guilty of a Misdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction before any Court of Conviction before a Justice or Record, be punished with Fine or Imprisonment, or both, at the Justices. discretion of the Court; and upon conviction in a summary man-ner before one or more Justices of the Peace, shall be punished by Fine, not exceeding Five Pounds, or by Imprisonment not exceeding one Calendar Month, at the discretion of such Justice or Justices.

VII. It shall be lawful for any Servant or Officer of the said New Power to apprehend offender. York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company, or for any other Person who may witness the commission of any such offence aforesaid, forthwith to apprehend the Offender, and take him before a Justice of the Peace, to be by him held to bail to answer for such offence, either before a Court of Record, or before one or more Justices, as the said Justice may determine.

VIII. All such Fines as aforesaid shall be paid, one half to the Appropriation of fines. party who shall prosecute for the same, and the other half to the Receiver General, for the use of the Colony; and no conviction that may be had before one or more Justices shall be quashed for want of form, provided sufficient shall appear in such conviction to warrant the same upon the merits.

IX. If any Action shall be instituted against any Person on Protection of party arresting: account of any such apprehension as aforesaid, the Defendant therein may plead the general issue, and give the special matter in evidence.
