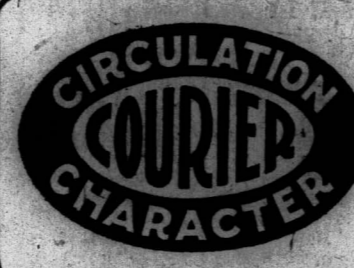

### PHILADELPHIA HAS BIG INFANT

**2 1-2 Years Old, Weighing 100 Pounds, Billy McCarthy is Some Baby**

A hundred pound baby just two years and nine months old, who moves furniture as a pastime with the ease of a piano-mover, and who eats as much as two adults at each meal, is baffling science in Philadelphia.

Doctors from near and far have studied him. He has been X-rayed and examined. They cannot find anything abnormal about him except his weight. They cannot explain his growth. His enormous weight is not due to fat, because his bones are as large as an adult's, five feet eight inches tall, and weighing 154 pounds.

The baby is "Billy" McCarthy, 127 Elmwood Avenue, Marlborough.

When he was born on August 23, 1914, in New York City, he weighed 9 pounds and 12 ounces.

He immediately began to gain at such a phenomenal rate that when he left the hospital with his mother 21 days later he weighed 39 pounds. A three-week-old baby weighing 39 pounds was an unheard thing even in New York City. He kept right on gaining until at nine months he weighed 89 pounds, and to-day, although he will not be 3 years old until August, he is as described above.

Billy has a brother, Frank, who is nearly five years old, with whom he plays like a doll, and Frank weighs "8-year-old" suits himself. Billy holds Frank on his hip like a plaything and pushes him around the McCarthy lawn in the "Irish Mail" cart with the facility of a baby elephant playing with a kitten.

And the interesting part about little Billy is that his mind is away above normal. It has not been hurt by his growth. He talks about things, reasons and asks questions which a child of six or eight would not think of. His mother says all the doctors who have examined him say that he is away above normal mentally, and just to let him grow as long as he is healthy.

"You see, I was a trained nurse before I was married," said the mother, "so I know a lot of doctors. They have heard about Billy, and a great many of them have examined him.

"I let him eat everything he wants now; I found that when I tried dieting him he put on more flesh than when I let him eat what he wanted. He almost eats us out of house and home. Even at his age, this baby eats as much as two adults."

He eats meat, but not much except chicken steaks and chops. His mother orders chickens three times a week for him. The milk order is four quarts of milk daily.

### STYNOSES OF CANADIAN NORTH

**WEST LAND REGULATIONS**  
The sale here of a family, or any male over 18 years old, who was at the commencement of the present war, and has since continued to be a British subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for District. Entry by proxy may be made on certain conditions. Duplicates of months residence upon and cultivation of land in each of three years.

In certain districts a homesteader may pre-empt, 40.00 per acre, Duties—reside six months in each of three years after earning homestead patent and cultivate 50 acres extra. May obtain pre-emption patent as soon as homestead patent on certain conditions.

A settler after obtaining homestead patent, if he cannot secure a pre-emption, may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$500 per acre. Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.

Assessors of estates may count time of employment as farm labourers in Canada during 1917, as residence duties under certain conditions.

When Dominion Lands are advertised or posted for entry, returned soldiers who have served overseas and have been honorably discharged, receive one day priority in applying for entry at local Agency's Office (but not Sub-Agency). Discharge papers must be presented to Agent.
