



#### SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN HOUSES

WEST LAND REGULATIONS

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, who was at the commencement of the present war, and has since continued to be a British subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must be a person at Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for District. Entry by proxy may be made on certain conditions. Details—six months residence upon and cultivation of land in each of three years.

In certain districts a homesteader may secure an adjoining quarter-section as free grant. Price \$100 per acre. Dishes made six months in each of three years after writing homestead patent and cultivation of 50 acres each. May obtain pre-emption patent on same homestead patent on certain conditions.

A settler after obtaining homestead patent, if he cannot secure a pre-emption, may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$100 per acre. Must reside six months in each of three years after writing homestead patent and cultivation of 50 acres each. May obtain pre-emption patent on same homestead patent on certain conditions.

### SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN HOUSES

WEST LAND REGULATIONS

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, who was at the commencement of the present war, and has since continued to be a British subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must be a person at Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for District. Entry by proxy may be made on certain conditions. Details—six months residence upon and cultivation of land in each of three years.

In certain districts a homesteader may secure an adjoining quarter-section as free grant. Price \$100 per acre. Dishes made six months in each of three years after writing homestead patent and cultivation of 50 acres each. May obtain pre-emption patent on same homestead patent on certain conditions.
