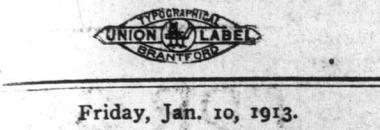

EXTENDING CITY BOUNDARIES

There is an agitation on foot in certain quarters for the enlargement of the boundaries of the City of Brantford.

That sort of thing looks very attractive to certain people, but it is not a step which should be lightly taken.

In the first place, Brantford, in proportion to population, has to-day a very large area—far larger than the average per population—viz. some 3,000 acres.

In the next place this extension game is an expensive job.

Some years ago, when a portion of the Township was annexed, the residents of the incoming regions were guaranteed the Township assessment rate for ten years, and they had in addition, to pay for fifteen years several mills less in taxation.

HOSPITAL MEETING

The regular monthly meeting of the board of governors of the General Hospital was held in the council chamber yesterday afternoon.

Mr C. H. Waterous, president, occupied the chair, and there were also present Mr. H. Cockshutt, vice-president, and Messrs Geo. Watt, A. K. Bunnell, Dr. Bell, T. H. Preston and R. Sanderson.

On motion of Messrs Bunnell and Watt the usual monthly accounts were passed.

The president reported that some difficulty had arisen with the Schultz Bros. Company relative to the contracts for heating and plumbing.

Moved by T. H. Preston, seconded by George Watt, that the matter of the Schultz Bros. letter of January 6 to Dr. Bell, and the letter of the Drake Avery Company, Limited, be sent to the city solicitor, and that Dr. Bell, as chairman of the building committee discuss the matter with him and get an opinion for the guidance of this board.—Carried.

Moved by H. Cockshutt, seconded by T. H. Preston, that the board of governors of the Brantford General Hospital hereby express their high appreciation of the efficient services of Miss Carson as superintendent of the hospital, for her assiduous attention to the duties of the office, and the high state of efficiency, which largely due to her efforts, the institution has now reached. Further, that they recommend an increase in her salary to \$2000 per annum, to date from January, 1913, and pledge her their continued support in the responsible position which she fills.—Carried.

Moved by George Watt, seconded by Dr. Bell, that the report of Miss Carson be filed and the house committee be instructed to inquire into the matter of wardrobes and report at the next meeting.—Carried.

Moved by H. Cockshutt, seconded by T. H. Preston, that the assistant secretary notify the various bodies entitled to send representatives to this board that the terms of office are about to expire, and ask that the necessary appointments be made and the secretary advised of the same.—Carried.

Attention was called to the fact that in maternity cases at the hospital many of the patients were in the habit of carrying away clothing which in cases of necessity was provided by the hospital authorities. It was decided that the public should be notified that patients in the maternity ward must provide all necessary clothing.

The board then adjourned.

that regard:—

"AND WE DIRECT that the said additions to the City of Brantford of the new territory included in the above description, shall, in addition to any others imposed by Statute, where not inconsistent therewith, be made upon the express terms and conditions following, that is to say:—

(a) That for a period of fifteen years from the first day of January, 1892, the rate of general taxation upon real and personal property within the said newly-annexed territory shall be less by five mills on the dollar than the rate for the City of Brantford as heretofore constituted and the assessment of real property within the said newly-annexed territory shall not for the next six years (commencing with the assessment to be made for the said City in the year 1891) be higher than that for the same property heretofore made for the said Township of Brantford for the year 1891, except to the extent of the increased values by reason of the erection of new buildings or by reason of land being hereafter during the said six years laid out in City Lots."

What did the above stipulation mean?

Simply that the new comers did not begin to pay taxes enough, for improvements and extensions in their district, and a heavy extra burden fell for years upon the older residents.

The City now possesses about 70 miles of streets. Some five miles of these are paved and the up keep of the rest has to be maintained and there isn't money enough coming in even now, to do that properly.

In the name of common sense, what on earth is the use of adding still more thoroughfares in more, or less, bad shape? Then there would be water extension, lighting extension and all the rest of the added outlay.

It might be that those living in the Township areas now in view would be prepared to come in on equal assessment ratings with the present city and to pay the full share of taxes, namely 22 or 23 mills. If
