OUR WEEKLY CHEESE BULLETIN.

B. D. Board of Trade Transactions—Reports from Other Markets. BROCKVILLE, Aug. 2.—Salesmen today manifested very little interest in registering goods.

Uncertainty is still the prevailing characteristic of the market. The public clock dropped to 4 1/2c, showing weakness also in the foreign market.

There was, however, considerable anxiety on the part of a few local men to purchase goods at present prices.

Representatives of the "big four" were very indifferent about buying at any price that salesmen would name.

About 5,000 boxes were registered, which is far below the quantity which could be sold if prices were high enough to meet the views of factory-men.

There were about 3,000 boxes sold, at prices ranging from 8 1/2c to 9c.
