### HIGH SCHOOL COMMENCEMENT

There was a great attendance at the A.H.S. commencement on Friday evening last. As usual, the lecture room of the school proved altogether inadequate to comfortably accommodate all desirous of witnessing and taking part in the exercises of the evening. Every inch of room was occupied, and even part of the limited space afforded by the platform had to be given up to visitors. Graduates of the school and parents and friends of students came from all parts of the county, thus illustrating in a pleasing way the general recognition accorded the importance of the Athens High School among the educational institutions of the country.

The trustee board for this year consists of A. W. Johnston, chairman; H. H. Arnold, Secretary; and trustees F. W. Scovil, W. G. Parish, T. R. Beale, S. Y. Bullis, M. M. Brown, A. W. Morris, nearly all of whom occupied seats on the platform.

The management of the function was in charge of the teaching staff of the school which consists of N. L. Massey, B.A., Principal. C. P. Bishop, B.A. W. C. Dowley, M.A. L. H. Graham, M.A.

The chairman named for the evening, Dr. M. L. Dixon, of Frankville, was unable to be present and Mr. A. W. Johnston kindly consented to preside.

The large audience rendered the presentation of the programme exceedingly difficult, and anything of a spectacular nature had to be abandoned.

The H. S. Glee Club opened each part of the programme with a chorus and their singing met with deserved appreciation. Mrs. Telgmann, of Kingston, gave several readings and was encircled on each appearance. Mrs. S. G. A. Lamb was in excellent voice and her rendering of "The Garden of Sleep" (DeLaza) was most artistic and fully merited the applause it received. The violin playing of Miss Mignon Telgmann, a little tot of eight years, was very popular with the audience. She is simply a prodigy, her playing of difficult selections as well as familiar airs being of a nature to delight and amaze her hearers.
