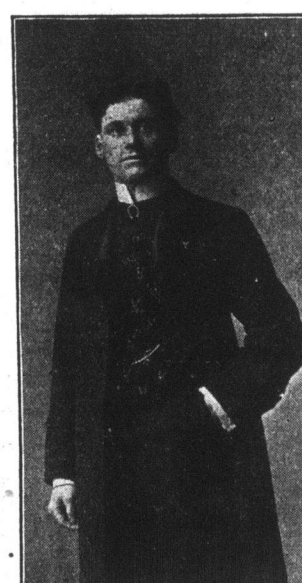

Not a word has been heard from her since.

The description of the wearing apparel found on the dead woman at South Haven is declared by Mrs. Partello's relatives to correspond exactly to a part of the young bride's trousseau. In weight and size she is said also to resemble the murdered girl.

South Haven, Mich., Oct. 8.—A story which the officers have known for several days, but which has been kept quiet in the hopes of being able to make an arrest on the strength of it, is told by Mrs. Mackey, the caretaker of the Willow Beach hotel, near which the body of the dead woman was found.
