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THE FIRST DIRECTORY.

Quaint Olden Time New York Busi-ness and Social Addresses. In the first directory of New York city, which was issued in 1786, there are some peculiar and quaint entries. For instance, in those days it was not uncommon for medical practitioners to sell drugs, as is shown by the following

address, "Samuel Bredhurst, physician and apothecary, 64 Queen (now Pearl)

Clergymen of that period were exceedingly precise regarding their titles. Thus, "Abraham Bache, reverend of the Church of England, 29 Smith street," and "Joze Phelan, clergyman of the Church of Rome, 1 Beekman

Leon Rogers, tailor, of 5 Broadway, was described as a "breeches maker;" John Bean, 60 Broadway, as "surgeon and tooth puller;" S. Crygier, 69 Cherry street, "punch and porter house;" Jo Deleplane of 132 Queen street, "Quaker speaker;" D. Hitchcock, 89 Queen street, "house carpenter and undertak-er;" John Hogland, 95 Queen street, "fiddler, etc.;" Heary H. Kip, 25 King street, "inspector of pot and pearl ashes;" John Nitchie, 7 Garden street, "starch and hair powder maker;" Sam-uel B. Webb, 29 Lower Dock street, "gentleman."
