and that grain that it drooped to earth, and that they were compelled to lose much of the grain, and that the quality of the grain was not the same as that of the grain that was threshed with the ordinary machines of the day; and that the "Toronto Reaper" we used was not so efficient as saving the worst possible condition of down tangled grain. With a poetry of motion as graceful as the wings of a bird, the long racks sweep around and gather the grain up and push it back to the rapid rotating knife, and on the other side the racks carry the grain to the falling stalks until sufficient has been deposited to make a good sized sheaf, when the racks rise is lost by the driver, and the succeeding arm sweeps the platform of the precious load, and delivers it in compact form for the binder.
