GENERAL REVOLUTION IN SPAIN

Exiled Member of Chamber of Deputies Says One is Coming. Paris, October 7.—Alejandro Lerroux, a member of the Spanish chamber of deputies and leader of the Barcelona Republicans, who is now returning to Spain for the opening of the Cortes, after two years spent in exile because of his bitter denunciation of the government, declared in an interview in Paris today that all the Liberal elements in Spain were concentrating, and that a revolution was not only possible but necessary and easy.
