### OPENING OF GERMAN REICHSTAG.

**Bismarck Supports the Military Bill.**  
**NO IMMEDIATE FEARS OF WAR.**  
**Russia Continues Her Preparations.**  
**DELIMITATION WORK COMPLETED.**  
**When the British Parliament Opens.**

HALIFAX, N.S., Feb. 7.

Prince Bismarck addressed the German Reichstag yesterday, warmly supporting the military bill. He was enthusiastically greeted by crowds along the streets during his passage to and from the Chambers. In his speech he said France had elected a peaceful President, and consequently the prospect of peace looked better. Germany had no fears of an attack from Russia. He believed the Czar's word absolutely. Russia continued to mass troops in readiness for the next crisis in the Eastern question, and the warlike tendencies of France and Russia compelled Germany to arm. The treaties between Austria and Italy, he said, were not a threat, but a declaration of common interest.

The French press declare that the publication of recent treaties will further estrange Germany from Russia and bind Russia and France closer.

It is stated that the Afghan Commission have completed their delimitation work.

The British Parliament meets on Thursday next.
