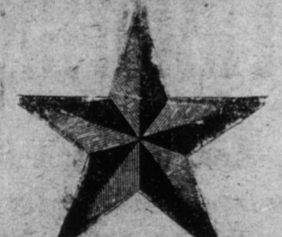

### Published by Authority

His Excellency the Governor has received the following telegram from the Right Hon. the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the same is published for the information of those concerned.  
JOHN R. BENNETT, Colonial Secretary, Colonial Secretary's Department, 14th September, 1914.

Attention of H. M. Government has been called to the fact that difficulties have arisen between shippers and shipowners in consequence of wish of latter to insert in Bills of Lading a clause to cover obligations which they undertake in many voyages, to call at a port in the United Kingdom for information, instructions or advice before proceeding on the final stage of the voyage.

Following is text of such a clause: "If and so long as the ship is insured against war risks with a War Risk Insurance Association under or in connection with the War Risks Insurance scheme of H. M. Government, the ship (in addition to any liberties expressed or implied in this Bill of Lading) shall have the liberty to comply with any orders or directions as to the departure, arrival, routes, ports of call, stoppages or otherwise whatsoever given by H. M. Government or any Department thereof or any person acting or purporting to act with the authority of His Majesty or of H. M. Government or of any Department thereof or by any Committee or person having understanding of terms of the War Risks Insurance on the ship the right to give such orders or directions and nothing done or to be done by reason of any such orders or directions shall be deemed a deviation."

Shippers do not realize that this requirement is for security of cargo equally to the ship and that it is not to prejudice their interests. I should be much obliged if your Ministers could by public notice or otherwise, explain to shippers the reasons for the requirements in question, so that it will be understood that their interests are being safeguarded and not sacrificed. sep16.11 HARCOURT.
