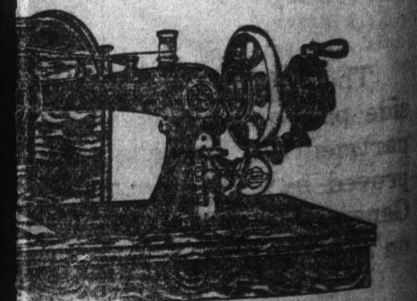

## Short Supplies of Butter and Cheese.

The increasing interest amongst city grocers and importers of butter and cheese was evidenced by the fact that at a meeting called by the Food Control Board for yesterday afternoon to consider this matter, some thirty persons were present. The Chairman of the Food Control Board, Sir Patrick McGrath, presided and read a series of telegrams between the local department and the Canadian Food authorities regarding the matter, showing that on July 8th an embargo was imposed on shipments of butter and cheese to Nfld., and that this was not lifted until Mr. Thomson was here last week when he undertook to remove the prohibition on condition that we claim for minimum quantities, but that on returning to Ottawa he found the situation such that it was only possible to provide licenses for this colony for what may be described as second grade of both commodities. In other words the best grades of butter and cheese are apparently being shipped to Europe for the Allied armies, and we will have to be content with what is available afterwards. The chairman stated that the position of his colleagues and himself was that our first duty here was to secure a sufficient supply of butter for the requirements of the local margarine factories in order that the production of the people should not be curtailed; and that if it was necessary, in order to do this, that the entire population, from the highest downwards, would have to use butterine, the Board would have no hesitation in enforcing such a policy. The chairman stated, however, that the Board would undertake than any supplies in excess of this requirement, if obtainable, would be distributed pro rata amongst the importers on the basis of their average import for the last two years. With regard to cheese, he intimated that we would apparently have to accept what the Canadian authorities were prepared to grant permits for, and he showed by telegrams that our own Board was now in close communication with the Canadian Department in regard to this. At his suggestion it was agreed that a committee of six be appointed to represent the importers, and assist the Board in working out the problems of importation and distribution of both commodities, and on motion of Mr. F. J. Stuee it was agreed that the chairman nominate the members of this committee, whereupon he named Hons. John Harvey and M. G. Winter as representing the butterine factories; Messrs. Rosseter and Williams on behalf of the Importers; and Messrs. Dempster and Duffy acting for the grocers. The meeting then adjourned on his intimation that as soon as the board was definitely able to work, the committee would be notified and called together.

After the ceremony the bridal party drove to the home of the groom's father, Mr. Thos. M. Wilcox, where a dainty repast was partaken of, and a very pleasant time enjoyed by all. The presents were numerous and costly and displayed the good taste of the donors, including one from the S. A. Band, of which the groom is a valuable member.

On Wednesday morning the happy pair left for Dildo, where the honeymoon will be spent, after which they will take up their residence at Bell Island where the groom holds a responsible position in the Mechanical Dept. of the Nova Scotia Steel and Coal Co. Ltd. The Telegram joins with their many friends in wishing the young couple many years of happy wedded life.—Com.
