TO-DAY'S MESSAGES.

WONT SUPPORT COALITION.
LONDON, Feb. 10.
Unionist members of Parliament who have signed the pledge to stand as Independent Conservatives and not as supporters of the Coalition in the event of an early general election are organizing a group and discussing their future line of policy. It is understood that this group will not take united action on the amendment in reply to the King's speech which is to be moved on Monday next, arraigning Government for extravagance but some of its members will probably vote with the Opposition parties. The group numbers about fifty.

LABOUR TROUBLE SETTLED.
DUBLIN, Feb. 10.
Differences between the Irish Railway management and employees which threatened to bring about a general strike on Feb. 15, have been settled. It is announced.

WILL JOIN ULSTER PARTY.
BELFAST, Feb. 10.
Field Marshal Sir Henry Hughes Wilson it was announced yesterday will join the Ulster Party upon his retirement as Chief of Staff of the British Army. He will be unanimously endorsed on Saturday as Unionist candidate for Parliament for North Down, it was stated.

SHIPPING CHARGES REDUCED.
NEW YORK, Feb. 10.
Twenty per cent. reduction in charges for stevedore work were yesterday approved for the port of New York at a conference of Shipping Board officials, ship operators and representatives of stevedoring companies. T. P. O'Connor speaking for the Shipping Board, announced that the new rates would be retroactive to February first and that they would be given a trial for sixty days. They will be continued indefinitely if satisfactory, he said. Mr. O'Connor left late yesterday for Boston where he said an effort would be made to arrange a similar schedule for New England ports.

RAILWAY ACCIDENT.
ANTIGONISH, N.S., Feb. 10.
Four cars went over an embankment. Eight were derailed and one passenger, J. J. Powers, Brantford, Ont., received minor injuries in wreck of Sydney to Halifax, this morning, at Antigonish near here.

REDUCTIONS RECOMMENDED.
LONDON, Feb. 10.
Co-ordination of British army, navy and air forces, under Ministry of Defence is advocated in report of Economic Committee headed by Sir Eric Geddes issued to-day. The Committee also recommends reduction in naval personnel of 35,000 men and cut in naval estimates for next year from \$1,000,000,000 sterling to \$600,000,000, exclusive of having brought about through ten year holiday agreed upon at Washington. Other recommendations include reduction of fifty thousand men in army and cut in army estimates of 20,000,000 pounds sterling. Cut of \$600,000,000 pounds sterling in air service estimates and reduction by eight and one half of the air squadrons allotted to navy and army. Trimming of education estimates by \$15,000,000 and also economies in services under control of the Board of Trade, agricultural and fisheries service and police and Civil Service Departments.

SCHOONER LOST.
KEYWEST, Fla., Feb. 10.
The three masted American schooner Herbert May, with lumber, has been lost near Marquesas, thirty miles from Keywest. There was no loss of life.

Facts About a Historic Institution.

The Privy Council held on the occasion of the Irish peace was the largest since the reign of William and Mary.

The history of this old institution is an amazing one; yet the public knows little of its romance.

In bygone days the country was virtually ruled by the Privy Council. Today its functions are in no sense autocratic, and all its deliberations are more or less of a formal character.

When it was at the height of its power, and known under its first name, the Great Council of the King, its duties were many and varied, and largely affected the conduct of the Royal Household. The members, as defined in the oath, include: "To advise the King to the best of his cunning and discretion; to keep the King's council secret; to avoid corruption; and to help and strengthen the execution of what shall be resolved."

A Curious Task.

Sometimes in the past the Council came to loggerheads with Parliament, and once, at least—when James I. set up Parliament's protest against his interference with Sunday liberties—came off best. As time went on its duties were merged into Parliament, and it became a much weakened body.

Some of the matters which the Council has taken in hand would sound strange to modern ears. In 1788 it took upon itself the duty of inquiring into the sanity of George III., and receiving the report of the Royal surgeons. Later, in 1821, it had sufficient strength to take up the question of Queen Caroline's right to be crowned Queen Consort.

A good idea of the old status of the Council may be gathered from the fact that the Cabinet was one of its sub-committees, and still is, for that matter.

The Council, however, is rarely consulted now and even when Orders in Council are issued they take the name Council in a purely formal manner. No Order in Council can be made which Parliament has not passed.

Nearly all the Council's duties are now carried on by such bodies as the Board of Trade and the Local Government Board, which are really offshoots of the Council.

One of its most important remaining functions is its part in judicial matters. Where the law courts have failed the Judicial Committee of the Council can step in and summon defendants and accusers before it.

Interesting, too, is the history of the Privy Seal which is appended to grants which are afterwards to pass the Great Seal, and to documents of minor importance which do not require the latter. Various reigning monarchs were at variance with the Privy Council over the Seal, but ultimately it was decided that anything which the Council had not passed could receive the Seal.

Only on very rare occasions is the full Privy Council summoned. The succession of the King, or a Royal marriage, may require a full Council. Perhaps the most famous meeting was that of November, 1839, when the whole of the Council was called to Buckingham Palace to receive Queen Victoria's announcement of her intended marriage.

Ordinary meetings of the Council—which require the attendance of only four or six—are usually held at intervals of three or four weeks in one of the rooms of the Palace. The business, as a rule, is purely formal, and, indeed, there is little hard work attached to a Privy Councilor's job.

Some of the members, all of whom are known as "Right Honourables," have never even put their foot inside the door of a Privy Council meeting.
