Monroe and clean Government.

There are thousands of dollars awaiting takers that Monroe will be elected in Bonavista.

Even Hickman's employees admit that Monroe will secure at least three of the four seats on the Southwest Coast.

To fill up the Journal, the Barker-Coady message was inserted three times. The fantastic editor forgot to change the date.

The best joke of all was the so-called message from Hawco and Carter which stated that they were nominated at Conception Hr.

The Advocates and Journal crew, which are all the same, did not know enough to say that the candidates were duly nominated at Hr. Main.

Surely Dr. Modell and Mr. Cloutier don't expect this form of bluff is going to convince the electorate.

Woodford and Cahill will sweep the district.

Messages and letters from all over the district give them a majority of 700, or more, despite the fact the total vote will be the smallest on record.

The Hickmanites are now looking for 2 to 1 that Monroe won't have 94 men.

They won't accept any odds that Hickman will secure 17 seats.

They have given up all hope of Bonavista, St. John's, East and West, Carbonar, Hr. Main, Placentia, Ferryland, and the Southwest Coast Districts, which total 20 safe seats for Monroe.

But wait until Bradley's majority is recorded and the one seat they are hoping for in Hr. Grace fades from them when Bennett, Russell and Simmonds will come romping home with record majorities.

No Siree! Hr. Grace is going to be in the new Government with three men. No split votes for Hickman or any other Coakerite.

The second city is not going to do the job in a half-hearted way but will go the full limit to destroy the menace of Coakerism for all time.

Hickman's plea for personal votes will fall as will be shown when the ballots are counted.

Hickman will be defeated in Harbor Grace and Monroe will roll up a splendid majority, bringing with him two colleagues by at least 500 of a majority.
