

How to Bottle Your Surplus Peas

Peas should be blanched before being bottled, as they contain a large amount of protein, which causes them to ferment more easily than most vegetables. They lose their colour considerably when bottled, but the flavour can be kept by adding a small amount of powdered borax to each bottle. The use of preservatives is not recommended. Useful grown peas for bottling, as the peas generally become too hard when just before bottling, and should be put into a pan of cold water for half a teaspoonful of salt, a pinch of washed mint, and a pinch of bicarbonate of soda, added to each quart of peas, weighed after shelling, and put on the fire, bring to the boil, and continue boiling for two minutes. Strain the peas and put them into a basin of cold water. Measure the amount of moisture, regulate for the number of bottles to be filled, and add to each pint half a teaspoonful of salt, a pinch of sugar, and a sprig of mint. Let this become cold, stirring occasionally.

Clean, Dry Bottles

When the peas are cold strain them and put them into clean, dry bottles with screw of clip tops. Shake the peas down occasionally while filling the bottles, and cover with the prepared water. Put on the rubber caps and caps loosely, place the bottles in a fish kettle or a large pan, and strain or some laths of wood spaced loosely together to fit the bottom of the pan. Pour in cold water to the necks of the bottles, place the pan over low heat, and bring the water slowly to the boil, or 200deg. Fahr. Keep it at this temperature for 1-2 hours, then take each of the bottles out separately and fasten it tightly before removing the water. Wipe dry, and when cold store in a dry, cool place. It is advisable to turn the bottles upside down a day or two after the peas have been added to see if any moisture comes from the lid. If this is so, loosen the lid and re-sterilise.

The memorandum, however, will be completed and forwarded. The Socialists are confident that their party's expected success at the next general election in Victoria will simplify the position.

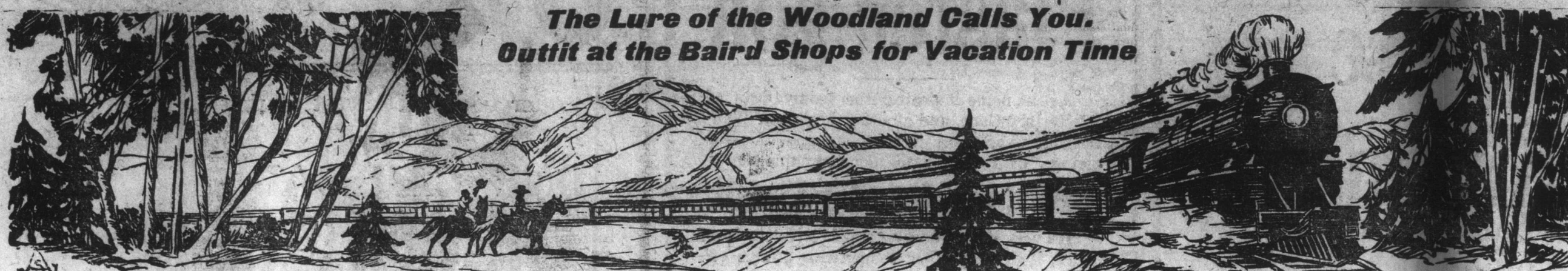
The New South Wales Premier, Mr. Lang, announces that:

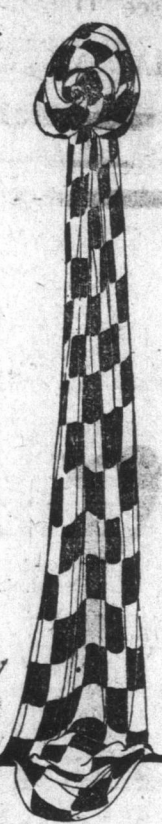

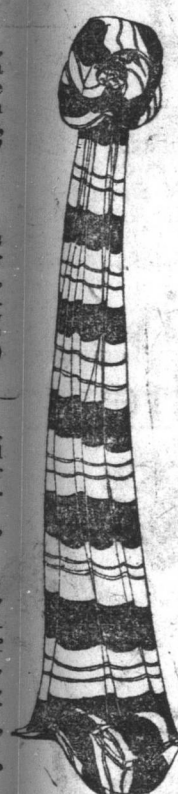
