

## A CRISIS IN SIGHT IN CHINA

### Marines From Foreign Fleets on the Move Towards Peking.

They Are All Acting Under the British Admiral—Foreigners Are Repairing the Railroad From Tien Tsin to Peking—Telegraph Lines Cut—Empress-Dowager Seeks Russian Protection—A Reform Manifesto.

London, June 12.—(3 a.m.)—The last message out of Peking to reach London left there yesterday morning at 11 o'clock, by way of Russian telegraph, through Manchuria, the Tien Tsin line being cut. It is as follows: "Gen. Tung, a Mohammedan, extremely hostile to foreigners, arrived this morning and had a long conference with Prince Tuan, father of the heir-apparent, who is seemingly friendly to the Boxers. Prince Tuan has been appointed chief of the Foreign Office over Prince Ching, who is more friendly towards the foreigners."

"The despatch of more marines was in response to a telegram from the Ministers to the consuls at Tien Tsin for additional troops. Convoys have left Peking to meet the troops coming by the first train."

"The arrival of the Empress-Dowager has rendered the city somewhat more quiet than it had been recently. At Tien Tsin the Viceroy finally consented to furnish transports for a relief force of 400 under an American commander. The partial restoration of the railway is expected to be effected by to-morrow. More massacres of Christians are reported to be in progress. Shanghai, under yesterday's date, cables that there has been strong street fighting in Peking since early Sunday afternoon."

The Shanghai correspondent of the Daily Telegraph, in a despatch dated yesterday at 1.40 p. m., says: Reports from the Yun Nan Fu district say that the French Minister has telegraphed that a crisis is imminent, and that he is advising all foreigners to evacuate Yun Nan.

All the telegrams indicate that the situation has not in the least improved. On the contrary, the disorder has spread from the neighborhood of Peking to the capital itself, which is growing turbulent in anti-foreign dominions. In addition to the burning of the Peking Club, the secretary of the Belgian Legation has been roughly handled in the streets. Hostile crowds continue to demonstrate against the legations.

Two thousand international troops are approaching the city, and the advance guard is due to arrive to-day (Tuesday).

### BRITAIN TAKING THE LEAD.

Russian and French Marines Are Acting Under British Officers.

Tien Tsin, June 11.—The captain in charge of the British defenses here commanded a third special train yesterday, and a fourth to-day, for the transport of 218 Russians and two guns and 62 French marines, with stores, and one gun for the British. The international forces are near Lang Fou, 40 miles from Peking, but it is doubtful if they reach the capital before Tuesday.

Russia Will Act Independently. New York, June 12.—A despatch from London from The Mail's correspondent at St. Petersburg, says there is not the least doubt that Russia's intentions are to act independently of other powers, even if momentarily seeming to be in accord with them.

Present a United Front. Paris, June 12.—In the Chamber of Deputies yesterday afternoon the Minister of Foreign Affairs, M. Delcasse, said regarding the Chinese insurrection: "A community of danger dictates to the powers their resolutions. I wish to set aside all questions of divergent views among them. What I affirm is that the surest guarantee of safety for each is a united front. If the Chinese Government does not seek to reform the insurrection, of which it appears neither alarmed nor even surprised, it must expect new and grave misfortunes. I have placed at the disposition of the French Minister all our naval forces in Chinese waters, and have instructed him to keep in constant communication with his diplomatic colleagues, among whom the most complete accord has not ceased to reign. The legations have just notified the French Minister that the Dowager-Empress that an end must be put to this peril which menaces the empire and European interests, otherwise the powers will act for themselves."

A Complete Understanding. In response to another inquiry, M. Delcasse laid stress on the fact that the most complete understanding existed between the powers for the defence of Europeans and the legations.

All in Except Russia. London, June 12.—A special despatch from Shanghai says: All the naval forces, except the Russians, are acting under the orders of the British admiral.

SIR CLAUDE MACDONALD. British Minister in Peking Gives Particulars of Recent Events.

London, June 12.—Sir Claude Macdonald, the British Minister at Peking, sent the following telegram to Shanghai on June 7: "The movement against the foreigners which has been allowed to grow to such an extent has resulted in the burning of railway stations and in the interruption of railway communication for five days. Two British missionaries and several foreign missionaries have been murdered in the district near Peking. In the country round numbers of converts have been murdered, and chapels have been pillaged and destroyed, while in the capital itself the British missionaries have been obliged to leave their houses and take refuge at the legation, which is defended by

70 marines. The Chinese Government is affected by these events so far as to send high officials to parley with the Boxers, but it does not show any intention of summarily suppressing them. Probably it still has power to do so, but the country is still strongly influenced by sympathy with the movement, and the spirit of the troops is doubtful. All is well up to the present."

More American Marines to Go. Washington, June 12.—The Navy Department has received the following cablegram from Admiral Kempff: "Tong Ku, June 11.—Secretary Navy, Washington."

Secretary Navy, Washington: "In case all communication with Peking be cut not able to go, if other nations go will join to relieve American pending instructions. Situation serious. Battalion of marines from Manila has been urgently requested. Answer. (Signed) "Kempff."

Upon receipt of the above, Secretary Long sent the following cablegram to Admiral Remy at Manila: "Navy Department, June 11, 1900. "Remy, Manila: "Send by Solace immediately all despatch to Kempff one hundred marines, arranging if practicable that after landing Solace shall continue homeward voyage as previously ordered. (Signed) Long."

Foreigners Landed. London, June 12.—A special despatch from Tien Tsin says it is reported the Dowager-Empress has fled to the Russian Legation at Peking.

Washington, June 12.—The following undated despatch has been received at the Navy Department: "Forces landed by different nations, Opening communications to Peking. Americans joined. (Signed) Kempff."

Admiral Kempff also reports the arrival of the Monceasy at Taku.

The Peking Club Burned. London, June 12.—A despatch from Peking, dated Saturday evening, June 9, says: "A body of 10 Boxers, armed with knives, have looted and burned the Peking Club, race track and grand stand buildings. Another edict issued this morning orders the Military Governor to police the streets with cavalry and infantry. United States Minister Conger has sent 20 marines and British Minister Macdonald 12 marines to guard the Methodist mission compound. Business is practically at a standstill."

FIVE PERSONS NOW DEAD. Some Aftermath of the McArthur Tragedy in Assiniboia. Winnipeg, June 12.—A Moosomin despatch yesterday afternoon says Henry McArthur has died since the despatch of Saturday. The dead now are Mr. McArthur and wife, and the three sons. Two other children are not expected to live. The eldest girl, aged 15, was left by the fiend, but why, only he knows. The five dead were buried yesterday in Moosomin. The murderer has a severe wound in his left side. He evidently intended to shoot for the heart. He is doing well, and is likely to recover. His motive for the deed is not known, although the police are in possession of certain facts which may show that the villain is a veritable brute. The community feel the shock keenly. The people are grief-stricken that such a respected family should be so foully dealt with.

Relatives in Ontario. Toronto, June 12.—When the news of the terrible murder of A. McArthur, his wife and two children, and the wounding of four other members of the same family at Welwyn, a small place 12 miles from Moosomin, Assa., on Saturday, was received here it brought grief and anguish in more than one household. At 240 Victoria street, where Mrs. M. K. Lankin, a sister of Mr. McArthur, lives, the intelligence came as a great shock. Mrs. McArthur, his wife, was a Miss Colville, of Chesley, Ont., and her sister is Mrs. J. H. Elliott of the same town.




