

CRISIS IN GREECE DUE TO THE WAR

Cabinet Resigns Because King Opposes Its Policy of Intervention.

CROWD CHEERS PREMIER

Students Want War, and a Demonstration Occurs in Athens Streets.

[Canadian Press.]

PARIS, March 7.—A dispatch to the Havas Agency from Athens says: "King Constantine has accepted the resignation of Premier Venizelos, and his Cabinet, and has requested M. Zaimis, governor of the National Bank, to form a Ministry. M. Zaimis asked the king to give him until tomorrow to consult with his friends."

"The Turkish Minister Salih Bey has declared openly during the last few days that massacres would take place in Turkey if Greece broke with the Porte, while Count Mirbach, the German minister, informed the diplomatic corps that Austria and Germany would immediately declare war on Greece if the Greek Government moved against Turkey."

Reuter's Athens correspondent in another dispatch says a grand council of former Greek premiers, which was summoned by the king, met Saturday afternoon. King Constantine presided. M. Venizelos and former Premier Dragoumis, Theodoris and Rallis, and General Doumoulis, chief of staff, attended. M. Venizelos explained at length the policy which his Government thought it necessary to pursue. M. Dragoumis and M. Rallis also spoke.

An immense crowd cheered M. Venizelos as he was leaving the palace, 173 correspondents says.

The correspondent says the resignation was brought about because the king did not approve the Government's policy regarding intervention in the war, and gives the following details: "Premier Venizelos, who had been in the palace at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon, and remained with the king for over an hour. Causes a Surprise.

"Returning to his residence the premier notified the ministers of the resignation of the king. The ministers then went to the chamber, where the premier announced the resignation of the cabinet. News of this action caused excitement in diplomatic circles, where it was a surprise.

"Yesterday Premier Venizelos, on receiving certain foreign ministers, announced to them that he would resign irrevocably if his policy did not receive the approval of the king, who now has called Alexander Zaimis, a former premier, for consultation."

"Concerning other events which took place yesterday prior to the resignation of the cabinet, the correspondent says: "This morning, when the king, accompanied by Premier Venizelos, left the cathedral, where a Te Deum on the anniversary of the taking of Ionia was celebrated, they both were acclaimed by crowds. This manifestation was interpreted as indicating the perfect accord of the nation in pursuance of its traditions. The newspaper La Patrie in this respect says:

"The Greek people, who have a real affection for their king, have no doubt he will safeguard the rights of the nation and will lead them to the way of 'Eros'."

Salih Bey, the Turkish minister, visited Premier Venizelos this afternoon."

Venizelos Gives Warning.

LONDON, March 7, 9:30 p.m. — A dispatch to Reuter's Telegram Company from Athens, says that M. Venizelos, speaking in the Chamber of Deputies today, declared that he had advised King Constantine to send for M. Zaimis to form a new cabinet. M. Zaimis, the retiring premier added, will not accept the policy of neutrality, and I hope that this policy will not endanger our newly-acquired territory."

"Our party," M. Venizelos continued, "will refuse to support any government which may be formed. Besides, M. Zaimis, if he forms a cabinet, will not come before the chamber."

"Should M. Zaimis accept the office of premier, the Chamber probably will be adjourned or dissolved. Otherwise his cabinet would be overthrown."

LONDON, March 7.—Telegraphing from Athens, the Exchange Telegraph Company's correspondent says the university students in the Greek capital made a demonstration today in favor of immediate action by Greece. The legations of the Triple Entente powers were visited by the students and cheered.

PRESS WANTS WAR.

LONDON, March 8.—12:10 a.m.—A dispatch to the Exchange Telegraph Company from Athens, says the Greek press, in its comment on the operations against the Dardanelles has declared itself in favor of Greece's participation in the war, taking the ground that no breaking up of the Ottoman empire should be permitted to take place without the collaboration of the Hellenic troops.

STRONGEST FORTS UNDER FIRE; TWO OF THEM ARE DAMAGED

East Indian Fleet Joins the Allies and Begins Bombardment of Fortifications of Smyrna—French Warships Hurl Shells From Gulf of Saros.

[Canadian Press.] LONDON, March 7.—The British battleships Queen Elizabeth and Prince George and the battle cruiser Indefatigable, with their eight 15-inch guns and an even dozen 12-inch guns, on Friday opened an attack on the principal forts on the European side of the narrows in the Dardanelles. Two of the forts were damaged and the magazine of a third was blown up. These forts, which guard the narrowest part of the straits from the European side, are believed to be the strongest along the entire waterway, although those on the opposite side of the narrows almost equal them.

One of these forts, marked on the admiralty maps as "L" is armed with two 15-inch guns, could hardly reach the Queen Elizabeth, which fired twenty-nine rounds from her 15-inch weapons by indirect fire, and had the advantage of aeroplanes to direct her gunners. The other two forts were armed with three 11-inch guns and some smaller cannon.

Meanwhile lighter cruisers continue attacks on the fortifications along the coast of Asia Minor, from Besika, which is near the entrance to the Dardanelles, to Smyrna, doubtless with a view of preventing reinforcements being sent to the straits where there already are a large number of Turkish troops, with whom the marines who were landed to complete the destruction of the forts at the entrance to the straits have been in contact. "It was in this land fighting that the Allies suffered casualties, according to the British report, of 19 killed, 35 wounded and three missing."

Last night's official dispatch from the admiralty disclosed that the East India fleet under Vice-Admiral Sir Richard Peirse, who is flying his flag on the Euryalus, has joined the allied fleet and that he undertook the bombardment of the fortifications of Smyrna which were seriously damaged. On Wednesday last the ships continued the bombardment of Port Dardanelles, on the Asiatic side of the Dardanelles. Destroyers and mine sweepers are pursuing the work of clearing the outer straits of mines. French ships are keeping up a bombardment from the Gulf of Saros.

The following announcement concerning the operations of the British fleet which is attacking the Dardanelles, in co-operation with French warships, was made Saturday night by the admiralty. "Further reports have now been received from Vice-Admiral Carden concerning the operations on March 3, and subsequent days.

"No action was possible on the 3rd until 2 p.m., when, although the weather was still unfavorable, the fleet, under Admiral Carden, resumed the attack on Port Dardanelles, and the concealed guns in this neighborhood. These were less active than before, and were dealt with by the ships with more certainty.

A useful seaplane reconnaissance located several encampments, and two permanent batteries.

Detachments Landed. "On March 4, the weather became calm, and sweeping and bombing operations within the straits continued steadily. Meanwhile demolition parties, covered by detachments of the marine brigade of the royal navy division, were landed at Kum Kaleh, and Seddili Bahr to continue the clearance of ground at the entrance to the straits. The party at Seddili Bahr discovered and destroyed four Nordfeldts. Some skirmishing ensued on both banks, and the enemy was found to be holding villages in force.

"On this day also, further down the coast, the Sapphires silenced a battery of field guns north of the entrance of Adramytti, and the defenses of Besika were shelled by the Prince George.

Casualties Sustained. "The following casualties were sustained on the 4th: Nineteen killed, 3 missing, 35 wounded. "On March 5 the attack was begun by indirect fire from the Queen Elizabeth on the defenses at the Narrows. This attack was supported in dealing with the batteries, by the Indefatigable and the Prince George. The fire was confined to Forts Rumlilch-Mejidieh, Hamidieh No. 2, and Namazieh, which are armed as follows: Fort 1, two 11-inch, four 5.4-inch guns, five 3.4-inch; Fort 2, two 11-inch, four 5.4-inch, one 11-inch, one 9.2-inch, eleven 8.4-inch, three 8.2-inch, three 4.5-inch.

The Queen Elizabeth fired 23 rounds with satisfactory results. The magazine in Fort 1, which is an important fort, armed with the best and heaviest guns, blew up. Two other forts were damaged.

"The fire of the Indefatigable and Prince George was observed from inside the Dardanelles by the Irresistible, Canopus, Cornwallis and Albion. Although these vessels were much fired at by concealed guns, they were not hit.

Destroy Military Station. "The Sapphires again fired on troops in the neighborhood of the Gulf of Adramytti, and destroyed a military station at Tuzburna.

"On March 5, also, the commander-in-chief of the East Indies, Vice-Admiral Sir Richard Peirse, arrived, with a squadron of battleships and cruisers off Smyrna. A methodical bombardment of Fort Yenickale was carried out during the afternoon for two hours, under favorable weather conditions. Thirty-two hits were secured, inflicting considerable damage on the fort and

COPENHAGEN (via London), March 7.—Germany is reported here, on what appears to be good authority, to be building a new type of small submarine of a new type which will be used for reconnoitering the home coast in the Baltic Sea. Each of the submarines, it is said, will carry a crew of eight men.

DRIVING GERMANS TOWARD FRONTIER

Russians Continue Their Offensive Northwest of Grodno.

AUSTRIANS WIPED OUT

Annihilated in Attempt To Cross to Right Bank of San.

PETROGRAD (via London), March 7.—11:15 p.m.—The Russian war office this evening made public the following official communication:

"Our offensive continues on the left bank of the Niemen and in the district northwest of Grodno. Our troops drove the Germans back behind the front of Sopozhin-Lepkovo and then pushed on vigorously.

"In a similar manner in the Mlava district our attacks were crowned with success. We took about 500 prisoners, including seven officers, and also three machine guns.

"In the left bank of the Vistula, in the region of the Pilica, the fighting is assuming the character of a great battle.

"In the Carpathians, between the Ondawa and San Rivers, the Austrian attacks continue. Southwest of Lutowski the enemy tried to cross to the right bank of the San, but in a counter-attack Saturday night the Austrian units, which had succeeded in crossing the river, were annihilated."

FRIEND OF THE CZAR DIES IN NEW YORK

Capt. Vassiliev Was Directing Purchase of Russian War Supplies.

New York, March 8.—Capt. Dmitri Vassiliev, acting naval attaché of the Russian embassy at Washington, who died yesterday, was stationed in this city to direct the purchase of war supplies for Russia in this country. Before illness prevented him from continuing his work it was said he had spent nearly \$100,000,000 in America.

Capt. Vassiliev was a personal friend of Emperor Nicholas of Russia, and for several years was the Emperor's aide on board the royal yacht.

GERMAN OFFICERS IN CONFLICT WITH TURKS

LONDON, March 8.—2:32 a.m.—Telegraphing from Cairo, the Daily Mail's correspondent says:

"During the retreat of the Turks after the recent Suez victory, before German officers had an open conflict with the allies, and 300 of the latter were killed in a single affair near Jerusalem."

TURKISH SHIPS ARE REPORTED AS ASSEMBLING

SPECIAL HOSPITAL

One To Be Opened at Compiegne Under Rockefeller Institute Doctor.

Paris, March 8.—A special hospital to be devoted exclusively to the care of wounded soldiers whose cases require delicate surgical operations will be opened this week at Compiegne, under the direction of Dr. Alexis Carl, of the Rockefeller Institute of Medical Research.

Particular attention will be devoted to the study of gaseous gangrene, for the treatment of which a new serum recently has been discovered.

ANOTHER CULEBRA SLIDE.

PANAMA, March 7.—The Panama Canal has been closed to all but the lighter draft ships by a rapid slide of earth from the top of the Culebra Cut, at a point north of Gold Hill. Further slide is probable, but no serious tie-up is expected.

FRANCE WILL HAVE ARMY IN NORTH AFRICA

Ready to Put to Sea at First Need to Help Against Turkey.

PARIS, March 7.—The war ministry announces that on account of the situation in the Dardanelles and in order to meet every emergency, the Government has decided to concentrate in north Africa an expeditionary force which will be ready to put to sea at the first sign that it is needed and be directed to the point where its presence is required.
