

**REDUCE FREIGHT
RATES IN U. S.****Railroad Companies Announce
Immediate Reduction.**

NEW YORK, Nov. 16.—An immediate reduction of ten per cent in railroad freight rates on farm products, for a period of six months, was agreed upon today by executives of the railroads of the United States.

In announcing the decision, Thomas DeWitt Cuyler, president of the Association of Railway Executives, stated that any reductions in such rates made since September 1, 1920, were to be included in the ten per cent, and that it would be put into effect without waiting for a reduction in wages. The freight rate cut will apply throughout the entire United States except on

traffic moving wholly within New England. The reduction will cost the railroads about \$55,000,000, it was estimated.

The new rates are applicable to carloads of wheat, corn, oats, other grain, flour and meal, hay, straw and alfalfa, manufactured tobacco, cotton, cottonseed and products, except cottonseed oil and cottonseed meal; citrus fruits, other fresh fruits, potatoes, other fresh vegetables; dried fruits and vegetables; horses, mules, cattle and calves; sheep, goats, hogs, poultry, eggs, butter and cheese and wool.

**URGES DIVERSION
FROM FREE TRADE****Mrs. Grange of London Ad-
dresses Norwich Liberal
Meeting.**

NORWICH, Nov. 16.—"A consistent record of steady advance for the masses has been that of the Liberal party," declared Mrs. Edward Grange of London, addressing a meeting here Wednesday in the interests of Mayor Dean of Tillsonburg, the Liberal candidate in the riding of South Oxford.

"The principle of responsible government," continued Mrs. Grange, "has always been adhered to under a Liberal government. Whenever any big issue was involved the people were always approached. The result has been that

in 1911 the Conservative cry was 'let well enough alone,' while now all that can be raised is the bogey of free trade which is absolutely contrary to the policy of every Liberal leader."

"During the 15 years of Liberal administration there was more progress made in Canadian agriculture and industry than during the preceding 30 years, and history must repeat itself."

Mrs. Grange dwelt at some length on the continued growth of government expenditures and the reckless waste of public money.

**TO ORDER GRADING
OF DAIRY PRODUCE****Department of Agriculture
Likely To Adopt
Measure.**

TORONTO, Nov. 16.—Regulations making compulsory the grading of dairy products to be exported, will probably be put in effect next season by the federal department of agriculture, according to J. A. Ruddick, dairy commissioner for Canada, in an address today before dairy produce graders from all over the Dominion, meeting here under the auspices of the Dairy and Cold Storage branch of the department of agriculture.

Mr. Ruddick emphasized the necessity for grading to insure uniformity of quality if Canada was to hold her

own against the strong competition in the principal dairy produce market, Great Britain. Canada, he remarked, was now the only large dairy produce exporting country in the world in which a system of compulsory grading was not in force.

The dairy commissioner assured his hearers that while it was expected to establish grading in Canada next year such would not be done unless he could secure experts to carry out the work.

The conference of dairy graders is especially notable this year, as it marks the first occasion in which all the provinces are represented.

**5 INJURED IN RAILWAY
WRECK IN TENNESSEE**

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn., Nov. 16.—The Suanee special on the Cincinnati Southern from Chicago to Jacksonville, was wrecked early today at Spring City, 35 miles north of Chattanooga. Four or five persons were reported injured, none seriously.

**TIME LOST BY STRIKERS
LESS THAN YEAR AGO**

OTTAWA, Nov. 16.—(Canadian Press.)—Loss of time throughout Canada, owing to strikes, during the month of October last, was less than during September, 1921, or October of last year, according to information contained in the forthcoming Labor Gazette. There were carried over from September sixteen strikes involving some 2,229 workers, and resulting in a time loss of 74,794 working days as compared with 22

strikes, 6,168 workers and 72,893 working days in October, 1920. None of the strikes in progress during October last were reported terminated at the end of the month.
