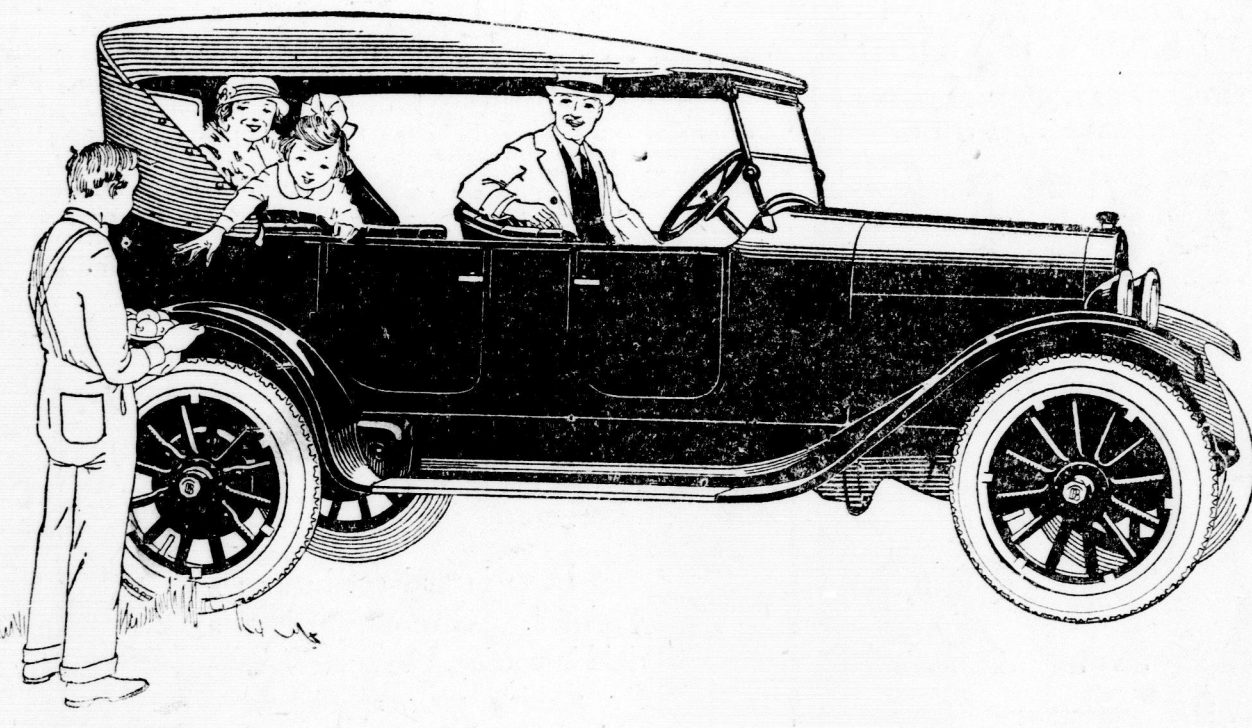
HANOVER TEAMS WIN AND LOSE.
