Condensed from the New York Sun St. Patrick's cathedral was filled with orshippers at 10 o'clock on Saturday morning, the hour set for the beginning of the ceremonies preceding the opening of the first council of the Roman catholic province of New York held since Cardinal McCloskey attained the cardinalate. Indeed, the vast seating and standing space of the cathedral had been exhausted for nearly an hour be-

At last the voices of the boy choristers were heard outside, chanting antiphonally, and scon the long train of acolytes, monks, deacons, priests, bishops and archbishops paced slowly up and gradually filled the chancel. It was like a picture of a gathering in the middle ages-the innocent faces of the singiug boys robed in scarlet, violet and white, the devoit expression of the younger priests, the weary, sad looks of some of the elder priests—some with intellectual heads, some looking practical and hard, as if they knew how to meet and battle with the spirit of tohow to meet and battle with the spirit of to-day. A group of carmelite friars had a far-away look, as if St. Teresa were whispering to them. Each bishop was accompanied by a theologian, whose black and white robes threw out the gorgeous red and gold of his chief's vestments.

chief's vestments.

During the mass, which was said by Bishop Laughlin of Brooklyn, the bishops had been ranged in seats on the epistle side of the altar, fronting the Cardinal's throne, the basks to the pulpit. of the attar, fronting the Cardinal's throne, consequently with their backs to the pulpit. Just before the sermon, after his eminence with his cross bearer and attending priests quietly departed, the master of ceremonies placed seats in an irregular double semicircle on the opposite side, and here the high dignitaries seated themselves in a most picturesque group, all glowing with scarlet and crimson robes and golden mitres, while afficient of lower degrees and more sober officials of lower degrees and more sober raiment sat on the chancel steps at their

As Bishop Loughlin seated himself in his As Bishop Loughlin seated himself in his chair of state on the opposite side of the altar, Cardinal McCloskey came from the secristy. Acolytes, bearing his jeweled archiepisoopal cross, mitre, barretta, and missal, on crimson cushions and carrying flaming tapers, preceded him. Above his red silk soutane he wore a surplice of lace, bound with a broad sash of red, watered silk, weighted with gold fringe. A pectoral cross gleamed upon his breast, and from the hand that grasped his golden crosier flashed his gemmed signet ring. From his shoulders flowed a mantle of crimson velvet, encrusted with religious insignia in gold. Pages in white soutanes and lace in gold. Pages in white soutanes and lace albs held in their glove! hands the hem of the mantle. The cardinal's mitre was of cloth of silver, set and tipped with jewels. At either hand were Monsignor Preston and Fether Racicot, S. J., the deacons of honor, in copes of crimson and gold.

Bishop McQuaid of Rochester preached an excellent sermon. He began by saving that

He began by saying that clerics and laics were all members of the mystical body of Christ, and he showed the mystical body of Christ, and he showed the importance of their relations to each other in every aspect of morals and manners. The unbelief of the present moment, the indifference of the multitude, the overweening leve of the world, the greed of gold—all the moving springs of our daily-life—were touched upon, and the preacher gave his addience distinctly to understand that the church in this council would set her face as a flint against some sins that society now condones.
