A BUDGET OF FAILURES.

A Parkdale Hotelkeeper Calls a Meeting of Creditors.

Mrs. Robinson of the Gladstone House, Parkdale, has called a meeting of her creditors for today. Her liabilities amount to \$200. She has only been in business about 12 months. A meeting of the creditors of F. S. Armstrong, general storekeeper of Fergus, was held yesterday afternoon in the office of Henry Barber & Co. The statement showed liabilities of \$3000 and assets of \$4000. The insolvent offered 40 cents on the dollar cash, and 60 cents on the dollar in scrip, bearing interest of 7 1/2 per cent on the dollar, and a promissory note payable in 30 days. These proposals were accepted, and will recommend the other creditors to do so.
