Mr. John Abbott's health has greatly improved and he will probably continue as Premier for another session at least—changes in the composition of the Supreme Court.

OTTAWA, Nov. 7.—It is just one month to-day since Premier Abbott left Ottawa for England, and beyond a telegram announcing his arrival it is said that none of his colleagues have heard from him.

As to what his future course will be there has been no intimation since he left, but the impression is gaining ground here that, as his health has improved, his views on the question of his resignation have become modified, and it is now expected that he will retain the premiership at least until the close of next session.

In this event there is a very good reason to believe that Sir John Thompson may listen to the advice of some of his friends and accept the Chief Justiceship and should be the only one at all improbable that there will be considerable change in the composition of the Supreme Court, two, and perhaps three, of the judges retiring and their places being taken by younger men. In this connection there is rumor that Justice Gauthier will be replaced by Mr. Girouard, M.P. for Jacques Cartier.
