Hitherto the Hospice of the Great St. Bernard, which stands 1,200 feet above the level of the sea, has enjoyed the distinction of being the most elevated inhabited building in Europe. This honor it can no longer claim. During the past year the city authorities of honor it can no longer claim. During the past year the city authorities of Catania, in Sicily, have caused to be erected near the snmmit of the great volcano, Mt. Etna, an astronomical observatory which stands 2,943 metres above the sea level, or fully 1,000 feet higher than the Hospice of St. Bernard. The structure is nine metres in height, and covers an area of 200 square metres. It consists of an upper and lower story, and is built in a circular form. In the lower story there rises a massive pillar, upon which is placed the great fairs.
