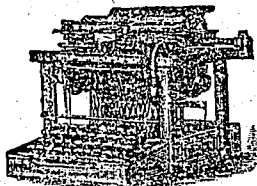

Commercial Summary.

THE map of busy life exhibited by the ad-
vertising columns of the JOURNAL OF COMMERCE
affords little evidence of dullness in trade.

THE S.S. Surrey left Rangoon on Monday
with a cargo of unhulled rice direct for Mont-
real.

MESSRS. F. McELDERRY & Co. of this city
have been appointed sole agents in Canada
for the sale of the output of the Canada Bat-
ting Company of Cornwall.

THE production of nails in the United States
for year ending Dec 31st, 1883, were 7,762,737
kegs against 6,147,097 kegs for the year pre-
vious, showing an increase of 1,615,640 kegs.

A DESPATCH from St. John, N.B., says
Jenner & Johnson, hardware dealers, Wood-
stock, N.B., have failed with liabilities of
about \$3000, and assets about \$2000. McDon-
ald & McLaughlan, general traders, Seal Cove,
Grand Manan, N.B., have assigned.

Nor least among the labor-saving contribu-
tions of the day is the General Index to the
Journals of the Legislative Assembly of Ontario
from the session of 1867-8 to that of 1882-3, both
inclusive, neatly bound in book form, and care-
fully compiled by Mr. Arthur H. Sydere, clerk-
assistant of the Legislative Assembly, Toronto.

AUTHORIZATION has at last been given by the
Assistant Receiver-General for Montreal to re-
deem the Dominion notes stolen from the office
of the Assistant Receiver-General at Toronto
in July 1878, and now held by the banks and
other innocent holders. The notes are of the
Toronto issue and bear the following numbers:
—\$1, No. 505001 to 506000; \$2, No. 145001 to
146000; \$2, No. 155001 to 156000.

LA BANQUE NATIONALE.—We are glad to find
by the report of "La Banque Nationale," which
will be found elsewhere, that after passing their
dividends for a period of a year and a half, the
directors have felt themselves able to declare a
dividend of 2 per cent, after making a large
appropriation for bad and doubtful debts. The
Bank continues to enjoy public confidence,
judging from its deposits and circulation.
