Through the Canadian International Development Agency's development assistance programs, as well as its participation in UN funds, programs and special institutions, Canada invests in strengthening the electoral processes, the judicial systems, legislatures, and independent media of developing countries.

## **UN Human Rights Bodies**

The UN network of human rights bodies may be viewed as falling into two categories:

1. legislative and policy-making bodies and 2. implementation and monitoring bodies.

However, functions can overlap, especially in the cases of major legislative bodies whose agenda combines policy and implementation questions.
