

AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA
AND
THE GOVERNMENT OF JAMAICA
ON AIR TRANSPORT

THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA AND THE GOVERNMENT OF JAMAICA, hereinafter referred to as the "Contracting Parties",

BEING PARTIES to the *Convention on International Civil Aviation*, done at Chicago on 7 December 1944;

DESIRING to ensure the highest degree of safety and security in international air transportation;

RECOGNIZING the importance of international air transportation in promoting trade, tourism and investment;

RECOGNIZING that efficient and competitive international air services enhance trade, the welfare of consumers and economic growth;

DESIRING to promote their interests in respect of international air transportation; and

DESIRING to conclude an agreement on air transport, supplementary to the Convention;

HAVE AGREED as follows:

ARTICLE 1

Headings and Definitions

1. The headings used in this Agreement are for reference purposes only.
2. For the purpose of this Agreement, unless otherwise stated:

"aeronautical authorities" means, in the case of Canada, the Minister of Transport of Canada and the Canadian Transportation Agency, and, in the case of Jamaica, the Minister responsible for civil aviation or the Jamaica Civil Aviation Authority or, in both cases, any other entity or person empowered to perform the functions exercised by those authorities;

"agreed services" means scheduled air services on the routes specified in this Agreement for the transport of passengers and cargo, including mail, separately or in combination;
