The following Orders of the House were issued to the proper officers:-

By Mr. Brasset:—Order of the House for a copy of paysheets respecting all work executed at Point of Head, Grosse-Isle, Magdalen Islands, Gaspe county, by the Public Works Department in 1932, 1933, 1934, and 1935, of which work Mr. Frank L. Prest was the foreman.

By Mr. Brooks:—Order of the House for a copy of all letters, correspondence and other documents exchanged between the Honourable the Minister of Fisheries, any official of the Department of Fisheries, and any other person, relating to the dismissal of Captain John S. Smith, of Lower LaHave, in the province of Nova Scotia, who was employed as Chief Steward on the Arras, and also to the employment in the same capacity of Captain Harris Himmelman, of Lunenburg, in the said province of Nova Scotia.

By Mr. Wermenlinger:—Order of the House for a copy of all correspondence and other documents, departmental and otherwise, in the possession of the Marine Department, relative to the dismissal of Paul Vezina of Boischatel, Quebec.

Mr. Church, seconded by Mr. Plunkett, moved,—That, in the opinion of this House, Canada should immediately adopt a comprehensive national housing, building, reconstruction, renovation, slum clearance, land settlement and reforestation policy adapted to its circumstances and also embracing as one of its main features a National policy for youth in relation to education and industry and employment, so as to get people off the dole and back to remunerative employment.

And further, that this House is also of the opinion, that in any such national reconstruction policy a lower rate structure for bank, mortgage and insurance loans is an immediate necessity. Such a reconstruction policy to also embrace protection for industrial workers in urban and suburban areas from forfeiture on the same principle as farmers and fishermen are now afforded by existing legislation.

After Debate thereon, the said motion was, by leave of the House, withdrawn.
