PRAYERS

The Order being read for the consideration of the Business of Supply;

Pursuant to Standing Order 58, Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Fairweather, moved,—That this House, noting that international and interprovincial crime rings are operating out of control in the drug trade in British Columbia, the loan shark business in Ontario and in mafia-type conspiracies in Quebec urges the government to act immediately—directly and through aid to the provinces—to protect the public and to bring these criminals to justice.

After debate thereon, proceedings on the motion expired.

A Message was received from the Senate, informing this House that the following Senators have been appointed to act on behalf of the Senate on the Special Joint Committee of the Senate and House of Commons on Employer-Employee Relations in the Public Service, namely, the Honourable Senators Asselin, Buckwold, Foldenberg, Macdonald, Neiman, Riel and Thompson. A Message was received from the Senate, informing this House that the name of the Honourable Senator Asselin has been substituted for that of the Honourable Senator Flynn on the list of Senators serving on the Standing Joint Committee on Regulations and other Statutory Instruments.
