CNR—CONSTRUCTION OF NEW HOTEL AT ST. JOHN'S, NEWFOUNDLAND

Question No. 1,336-Mr. Carter:

- 1. Is CNR planning the construction of a new hotel at St. John's, Newfoundland and, if so (a) on what date will construction commence (b) what are CNR plans for the existing hotel in St. John's?
- 2. Have negotiations commenced for the acquisition of a site and, if so, at what location?

Mr. Gérard Duquet (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Transport): The Management of Canadian National Railways advises as follows: CN is exploring various means of improving its hotel operations in St. John's, but no final conclusions have been reached and the answers to the specific questions asked are in the negative at the present time.

INFORMATION RELATING TO ORDERS IN COUNCIL

Question No. 1,357-Mr. Fortin:

- 1. Is it intended that Orders in Council P.C. 1960-11/944, amended by P.C. 1966-9/707 and P.C. 1952-12/4544 regarding the responsibility of the State be published and, if not, for what reasons?
- 2. Is it the intention of the government to submit legislation ensuring that the State shall be considered on the same basis as an adult capable person?
- Mr. Barnett J. Danson (Parliamentary Secretary to the Prime Minister): 1. Order in Council P.C. 1952-12/4544 was revoked by Order in Council made September 23, 1970 and was replaced by National Defence Claims Order 1970 that was published in the Canada Gazette on October 14, 1970. It is intended that the Claims Regulations that were made by Order in Council P.C. 1960-11/944 and were amended by Orders in Council P.C. 1966-9/707 and P.C. 1968-10/1853 will shortly be revised and published immediately thereafter.
- 2. The Crown's liability in tort and civil salvage is set out in the *Crown Liability Act*, S.C. 1952-53, Chapter 30. Whether the Government intends to submit legislation amending the Crown's liability is a matter that the Government will no doubt give notice of in due course.
