Quercitron, or extract or oak bark, for tanning.
 Quicksilver.
 Quinine, sulphate of, in powder.
 Rags of cotton, linen, jute and hemp, paper waste or clippings, and waste of any kind, fit only for manufacturers of paper.
 Rattans and reeds, unmanufactured.
 Recovered rubber and rubber substitute.
 Red liquor, a crude acetate of aluminum prepared from pyroligneous acid for dyeing and calico printing.
 Rennet, raw or prepared.
 Resin, in packages of not less than 15 gallons.
 Rhubarb root.
 Roots, medicinal, viz: Aconite, calumba, ipecaouanha, sarsaparilla, squills taraxacum, valerian.
 Rubber, hard, crude, in sheets, plain or moulded.
 Salt cake, being a sulphate of soda, when imported by manufacturers of glass and soap for their own use in their works.
 Salt, imported from the United Kingdom or any British Possession, or imported for the use of the Sea or Gulf fisheries, not otherwise provided for.
 Saffron and safflower, and extract of.
 Saffron cake.
 Sal ammoniac.
 Sal soda.
 Sand.
 Sausage skins or casings, not cleaned.
 Sea-weed, not elsewhere specified.
 Sea-grass.
 Seeds, anise, coriander, cardimon, fennel and fenugreek.
 Senna, in leaves.
 Settlers' effects, viz.:—Wearing apparel, household furniture, professional books, implements and tools of trade, occupation or employment, which the settler has had in actual use for at least six months before removal to Canada, musical instruments, domestic sewing machines, live stock, carts and other vehicles and agricultural implements in use by the settler for at least one year before his removal to Canada, not to include machinery, or articles imported for use in any manufacturing establishment, or for sale; provided that any dutiable article entered as settlers' effects cannot be so entered unless brought with the settler on his first arrival, and shall not be sold or otherwise disposed of without payment of duty, until after two years of actual use in Canada; provided also that under regulations to be made by the Minister of Customs, live stock, when imported into Manitoba or the Northwest Territory by intending settlers shall be free, until otherwise ordered by the Governor in Council.
 Shellac, white, for manufacturing purposes.
 Silix, or crystalized quartz.
 Silk, raw or as reeled from the cocoon, not being doubled, twisted or advanced in manufacture in any way, silk cocoons and silk waste.
 Silver and German silver in sheets, for manufacturing purposes.
 Skins, undressed, dried, salted or pickled.
 Soda ash.
 Soda, bichromate of.
 Soda, caustic.
 Soda, silicate of.
 Sodium, sulphide of.
 Spelter, in blocks and pigs.
