your Patience; for you may reft affured, that nothing is known to have been done fince the Prorogation of Parliament, except what you have read in the Papers, and you may poffibly find Reafon to make fome Deduction from the Intelligence you draw from thence.

You will charge me with imitating my Betters in an affected Ignorance; but, believe me, I am not one of those who wish to be accounted wise, for faying nothing; and, I will venture to fay, that there are fome of those Betters who are as totally ignorant as myself.

There are different Speculations upon the Reafons of this Secrefy. Some are fanguine in their Hopes, that it promifes the Deftruction of our Enemies; others, perhaps from the fame good Principles, appreappr not
