

Young's, Patterson's, and Black Creeks, together with several other smaller ones, and one sulphurous spring. It contains two blacksmiths, six grist mills, (in two places,) seven saw-mills, one fulling mill, one carding-mill, 6 distilleries, seven stores, two masons, three joiners, two tailors, 4 shoe-makers, 3 weavers, 1 hatter, 2 religious societies (Methodist,) 1 Divine, (M.) 1 meeting-house (M.) 1 village (Dover,) 1 philosophical society, 3 schools, 3 physicians, 1 attorney, and 1 masonic society.

### CHARLOTTEVILLE.

This township lies still west of Woodhouse, and will bear nearly the same description, although (if possible) better watered. It has been settled about seventeen years, by people from the United States.

It contains four grist mills, 3 saw-mills, 3 distilleries, 3 tanners, 4 shoe-makers, 2 tailors, 3 blacksmiths, 4 carpenters, 2 stores, 2 hatters, 1 potter, 1 physician, 2 religious societies (1 Methodist and 1 Baptist) 1 meeting-house (B.) 2 public buildings, (a court house, and jail) 1 singing-school, and 3 reading schools. There is a mine of excellent iron ore lately discovered. There are also some large though shallow marshes, or natural meadows, from which there is annually taken a large quantity of hay.
