NOTE.—The foregoing returns show the population of the *Town of York*, in the years 1826 and 1830. In 1834 *York* was incorporated, under the name of the *City of Toronto*; and the population of the *City* for each year, from 1834 to 1847, inclusive, is given above. The Census has been taken in the summer of each year. Of the Denominational Census, the adherents of the United Church of England and Ireland form the largest class, and next to them the Roman Catholics. The table shows six distinct classes of Presbyterians, numbering together 3,254 souls. The "*United Secession Church*," and the "*Relief Church*," having become united, have assumed the name of "*the United Presbyterian Church*." The table also shows six distinct classes of Methodists, numbering together 2,865 souls; but since the Census was taken, the "*British Wesleyan Methodists*," and the "*Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada*," have been re-united into one body.
