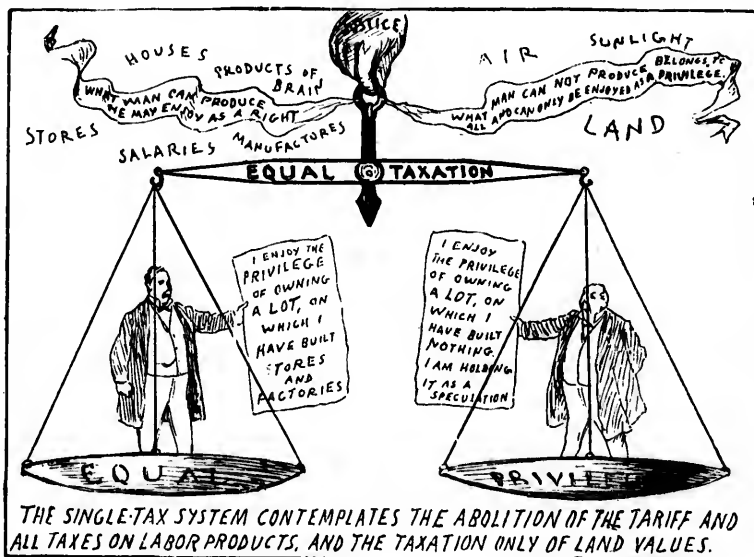


LABOR AND CAPITAL TO ACTION (1900)
