

FRATERNAL SOCIETIES GROWING IN WEALTH

Ontario Registrar's Report Shows
Great Progress in Ten Years
—Influence Increasing.

That the fraternal societies are growing in wealth and influence may be seen from the following figures, tabulated in the report of the Registrar of Friendly Societies recently issued. The figures show the increase in the number of societies during the ten years now past. 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At one time the National Museum had on exhibition a silver baptismal basin, coming originally from Holland in 1584, and closely connected with the colonial history of New York.

This was loaned to the museum by the Colonial Dames of New York, but subsequently recalled by them. Mrs. Marcus Benson, who was the prior of the selection for the Colonial Dames, promises, however, that this exhibit will be a valuable nature and will consist of both church and household silver of the Colonial period collected from the southern and eastern parts of the United States.

The church service above mentioned dates back to 1724, when it was presented to St. Ann's Parish, founded a century years before, in Essex County, N.Y. There was a tradition that the silver to the effect that the service was presented by Queen Ann, but as she died in 1714, and this service is dated 1724, this is impossible, also it did come from the fund the established known as "Queen Ann's Bounty." One of the cups and the paten were lost for many years and were not discovered until 1899, when Richard Thomas Lewis, then rector of the parish, learned of their location and succeeded in purchasing them from Charles A. Munn of New York, who was the prior of the parish, also he had purchased them from Howard & Co. of New York, three years before.

Up to the time of their purchase from Howard & Co. by Mr. Munn no history of the lost cup and paten is available, although they are described and listed with a cut in the 1899 edition of Ruck's "Old Plates." The present rector of St. Ann's accounts for this loss by the fact that at one time two churches existed in the parish, between which the silver was undoubtedly divided; one known as Vawter's and the other an old church abandoned after the Revolution and later destroyed. The silver was probably appropriated.
