

Baseball Giants or Red Sox?

Note and Comment

Local fans are pretty nearly evenly divided in their sentiments towards the Giants and White Sox. The Jeff Tamont of New York was with us only a year ago, Bill Carrigan, who helped to win the pennant in 1907, at Diamond Park, is still very close to the hearts of Toronto's baseball people, and likely there is a margin pulling for Boston. Carrigan may not work next week, as he is troubled with a finger that was injured in Washington on Saturday. Then Cady, with Newark last season, will do all the catching in the big games. He is regarded as one of the greatest throwing backstops in baseball. In any case Cady will work as Joe Wood's partner.

It is a foregone conclusion that Chief McGraw will catch all of the big games unless disabled and that the Giants' strategy is to make up for McGraw's absence by having a tower of strength ever since he signed with the New York Club. When quick-witted strategy is necessary McGraw generally makes the right move. Generalship will be an important figure in the series with the Red Sox and McGraw will be there with bells on. Jesse Stahl has managed the Beaneaters with keen judgment, backed up by the foxy McGraw, but McGraw is a match for them both. Without McGraw's presence on the bench and coaching lines the Giants' chances for a victory would be considered slim, say baseball sharps, for he is a born leader, a determined, aggressive fighter who seldom loses a game. The Giants triumph a large share of the credit will belong to their plucky manager.

Comparing the rival players, man for man, is interesting, but it doesn't tell anything. Luck plays a leading role in ball games and if the Giants get the jump on the Red Sox, the latter will be in New York next Tuesday their confidence will be increased twofold. Almost everything depends on the work of the rival pitchers. That much is admitted on both sides, but a lucky hit or an unlucky error may turn the tide. The Giants gained much experience in last year's world's series and that will count for something. McGraw has a veteran team, so to speak, while the sensation of playing for money and glory will be comparatively new to the Red Sox.

Here is something worth remembering: Umpire Klein will call balls and strikes at all the games in New York, with Evans on the bases. In Boston, O'Loughlin will preside behind the plate while Higley will decide the plays on the bags. In the Red Sox camp O'Loughlin and Higley will be stationed on the foul lines in the outfield, while Alex and Evans will attend to similar duties in the hub. Thus will the home team have the assistance of their own umpires.

Wouldn't it be surprising if Rubie Maquard suddenly regained his early season form? He is the only pitcher in the league who has pitched better than he has in the past few weeks. Maquard was clearly overworked in his attempt to beat the Boston Red Sox. He broke down under the terrific strain and McGraw then decided to let him recover his nerve and stamina. The guard is working like a beaver in private just now and it is broadly hinted that McGraw will have him back up to the top notch. If the Rubie can duplicate his phenomenal pitching of last spring there will be a panic in Beantown.

Will the Red Sox try bundling to beat Tereau? The Toronto man weighs 235 pounds and the Hub sharps seem to think that he will find it a difficult matter to handle balls that are dumped down near the plate. Tereau's inclination to bundle will be a great help to the Sox. The fact that Tereau was a spit ball pitcher in the past is a fact that a majority of the American League's best pitchers employ the same delivery. Boston spies have tipped the Sox to be wary of Tereau's low ball, which he may find hard to control. In short it is plain that Tereau is a source of much worry to the Red Sox.
