The director of dairy instruction his week called a meeting of the chief ociations to meet in Toronto, Those esent were Chief Instructors G. H. arr and G. G. Publow, Sanitary Inpectors T. Dillon and J. H. Echlin, resentatives of Eastern Dairymen's Association, R. G. Murphy, J. R. Dargavel, M.P., and J. H. Singleton, Western Association, Thomas Ballantyne, John McLevin and J. N. Paget.

The dairy instruction of the past few years has resulted in a marked improvement in the general equipment nd sanitary condition and sanitary conditions of factories.

Many proprietors and makers have, however, stated to the instructors and members of the Dairymen's Associations of the Dairymen's Association of the Da tions that they were somewhat dis couraged after going to the expense and trouble which were found neces-sary to make the improvements con-sidered essential by the dairy instruc-

pense in order that the quality of cheese may be of a higher standard, but our neighbor factories have gone on in the same old way ma ing along cheap lines, and they, for the most part, secure as high a pri-for their cheese as the better equippe factories. In many cases the run factories manufacture for a lower rate than a well equipped and im-proved factory, thus making the burden still greater for those who are an-xious to do what is essential if the industry is to be placed on a sure and permanent basis," they say.

Inspectors Busy.

Inspectors Busy.

The sanitary inspectors for the past year, J. H. Echlin and T. Dillon, have effected a marked improvement in the sanitary conditions of the factories. They went out from the department clothed with authority to insist upon improvements which were necessary, and which had, in many cases, been recommended by the instructors, but which had not been made. Many expressions of appreciation of the work accomplished by these ections and the better class of dairy-nen thruout the province are strongly of opinion that work of this nature should be followed still more closely

during the coming season.

The representatives of the Dairy
Associations and the chief instructors as well as the regular staff of in-structors are of one opinion as to the advisability of clothing the instructors with the power of sanitary inspec-tors and so arranging the districts that every factory and creamery will be subject to regular and systematic sanitary inspection, and may have the benefit of instruction as well. In order that the said opinions

In order that the said opinions might be put into tangible form to be placed before the minister of agriculture the meeting was called. After discussing the subjects before them at great length they unanimously decided upon the following system: Dividing the Province.

1. That the whole province be divided into such sub-divisions as would give each inspector from 35 to 36 factories or creameries. This will require a staff of 38 instructor-inspectors, and it is considered by those who have had the work in charge that who have had the work in charge that the man appointed to the work would be able to render more effective serbe able to render more effective service than in past years, Many of the better factories are really not in need of regular instruction, and in the majority of cases a call of an hour or two from the instructor will be just as effective as to spend a whole day with the maker in manufacturing a lot of cheese. This will give the instructor-inspectors an opportunity to visit many of the farms and to advise with the producers as to the best method. the producers as to the best method of producing the desired quality of milk. In the opinion of the chief instructors the chief essential in producing a first-class article is that the raw metallal procedure of the industry to have a result of the industry to have raw material receive proper attention by the producer and milk hauler. Chief Instructors Barr and Publow stated that "90 per cent, of the rejections can be traced to inferior raw
